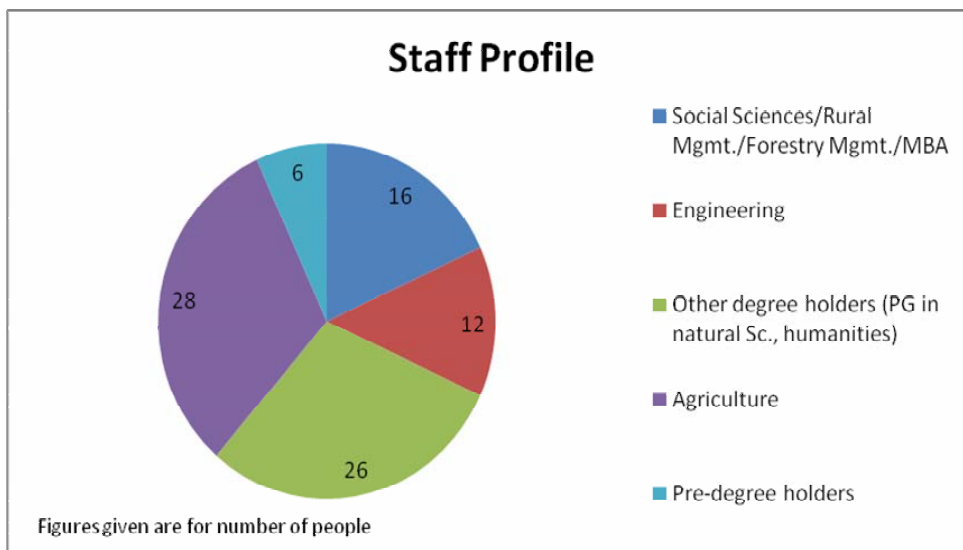

Particular emphasis is placed upon the poor and women.

Areas of expertise

The key competencies of ASA can be broadly categorized into:

- **Field implementation** especially in community based natural resources management sector which includes community mobilization and participatory implementation of NRM programs, Micro credit, Participatory irrigation

management; Local governance and capacity building of the involved community, their local institutions including PRIs.

- **Development support** (Technical support) to the NGOs, Government departments/projects and donor organizations in the areas of NRM, Agriculture technologies, Micro credit, Local governance, Project management and Institutional development.
- **Action Research, Consultancy and policy advocacy** in the areas of NRM including Participatory Technology Development (PTD) in agriculture, Participatory Monitoring & Learning.
